Why a Code of Conduct?

Playing Games is a great way to connect with others, create stories, and have fun—as long as everyone feels safe and respected. Unfortunately, there are also many horror stories where boundaries were ignored, personal differences were disrespected, or conflicts were mishandled. The aim of this Code is to help avoid these problems and clarify the kind of behaviour we expect from everyone using the club's premises for games or otherwise.

Be kind to each other

While opinions may differ, we respect those differences, recognize our shared passion, and treat everyone with kindness and understanding. Refrain from discriminatory comments and personal attacks. Listen carefully and don't interrupt. If disagreements arise, resolve them calmly and outside the game.

Make sure everyone feels welcome

Strive to create a welcoming space for all—regardless of race, gender, sexual orientation, religion, disability, or other identities. If you witness inappropriate behaviour in or out of the game, speak up. It's fine for in-game races to have strained relationships or for an in-game government to treat in-game people unequally, but at the table, we play together—not against each other. Neither roleplay, immersion nor some house rules are an excuse for discrimination, harassment, or disrespect towards players or real-world minorities.

Make it safe and fun for everyone

We're here to have fun, but never at the expense of others. Be honest about your boundaries and preferences. Address discomfort directly or through safety tools, and respect others' boundaries. Share feedback kindly, take responsibility for mistakes, and see feedback as an opportunity to grow.

If you feel uncomfortable, talk to the game masters or the organizers. If this does not help or is not possible, contact the KuL board.

Respect people's boundaries and privacy

Everyone has different comfort levels around sharing personal details. It's perfectly okay to keep your hobby separate from your private life or work. Respect others' wishes if they choose not to discuss personal matters at the table, online or in the game spaces. Personal stories shared within the group should stay private unless all agree otherwise. Never share personal information about others without their permission.

Respect the game and your fellow players

Prepare in advance if requested. Arrive on time and notify the group in advance if you'll be late or absent. Be respectful, collaborative, and fair. Support a fun and inclusive atmosphere where everyone can participate and enjoy themselves. Follow the rules, respect the host or facilitator, and avoid unnecessary disruptions or distractions. Play to have fun, win with humility, lose with grace, and help make the experience enjoyable for all.

Nurture a positive community

Our shared story continues beyond the session. Be respectful and supportive before, during, and after games—including chats, planning, and social events. Encourage new players and GMs, share your passion, and help build a community we can all be proud to adventure in.
